

WHAT'S HAPPENING

The 11th annual Jonnycake Storytelling Festival begins tonight and will run through Sunday, featuring 16 storytellers offering stories and fun for all ages. Tonight's program, geared for families, is called "Ghost Stories," and will be held at 7:30 at South Kingstown High School, 215 Columbia St., Wakefield. Admission costs \$5 for adults or \$3 for children. Tomorrow's schedule will begin with workshops from 9 a.m. to noon, followed by free stories on the Village Green, off Kingstown Road, Peace Dale. Morning workshops will be geared for teens, teachers and librarians, and the free storytelling is geared for the entire family. At 7:30 p.m. Saturday there will be a program geared for adults called "Many Voices... One World," at South Kingstown High School. Admission will cost \$8. At 9:30 a.m. on Sunday at the Neighborhood Guild, 325 Columbia St., Peace Dale, the festival will conclude with a program called "Sacred Tales," geared for older youths and adults. Admission, which will include a continental breakfast, costs \$6. The festival is sponsored by South Kingstown Parks and Recreation, the R.I.
